Applying to the New School for the 2017-18 School Year

Application packets for the new school will be available on Sunday, January 29, at our Catholic Schools Week “Sneak Peek” Gathering. Be sure to pick up a packet for each of your children. The application packet is specifically designed for students currently attending Our Lady of Sorrows, St. James the Greater, and St. Joan of Arc Schools. New Student Application Packets for incoming Kindergarten students will also be available.

As a reminder, tuition and fees for the new school are as follows:

Application Fee: \$50.00 per child at time of application (check or money order)

Tuition:

One Child	\$4,500
Two Children	\$6,500
Three Children	\$7,500
Four or more Children	No additional charge other than the application fee

Completed application packets and application fees should be returned to your current school site office no later than **Friday, February 24**, in order to secure a spot for your child/children. Open enrollment for new students will begin on **Monday, February 27**.

School Planning Updates

Preschool

The pastors have made the decision to continue to maintain their preschools as parish-run preschools.

Before and Aftercare

Programs

The new school will provide both before and aftercare programs for students in grades K – 8. Program specifics and fee structures are being finalized and will be shared soon.

Athletic Association

The pastors are planning to meet with the presidents of the three Athletic Associations to discuss what direction the program might move in.

Sacraments

The pastors have proposed the following for the reception of the sacraments for Catholic students attending the new school:

First Reconciliation and **First Communion** will occur in the parishes and will be coordinated to occur on the same date.

Confirmation will take place at the Cathedral Basilica in the spring of the school year. Students in grades 7 and 8 will be prepared for the Sacrament of Confirmation every other school year.

Come Out and Play! – Open Gym Night on Friday, January 27, from 6:30 – 8:30 p.m.

All families from Our Lady of Sorrows, St. James the Greater, and St. Joan of Arc are invited to come build community, make new friends, and enjoy some fun activities at an Open Gym sponsored by St. Joan of Arc parents on Friday, January 27, from 6:30 – 8:30 p.m. Please consider bringing a snack and 2 liter bottle of soda to share.

Principal Search and Teacher Hiring

Nine potential candidates have submitted their letters of interest and resumes for the principal position. As this position is critical to the success of the new school, we have asked Stephanie Welling, Associate Superintendent for School Personnel, to assist with vetting candidates and determining which individuals will be invited to interview for the position. We are looking for a principal who possesses the following characteristics:

- Practicing Catholic
- Genuine love and understanding of, and compassion for, children and their families
- Master's degree in administration/educational leadership with proper educational credentials
- Understanding of, and commitment to, the philosophy of Catholic education
- Demonstrated leadership ability or potential

- Knowledge of and demonstrated administrative skills and abilities appropriate to the overall operation of an elementary school
- Knowledge of and demonstrated successful experience in instructional leadership, including curriculum development, instructional methodology, assessment practices, and professional development planning and facilitation
- Strong interpersonal and relational skills, especially in the area of communication

The interview process will begin the week of January 23 and updates will be provided as the process moves forward.

Current teachers from Our Lady of Sorrows, St. James the Greater, and St. Joan of Arc Schools attended a meeting at the Catholic Education Office on Thursday, January 5. Items discussed included: how to apply for a teaching position to the new school,

as well as other Catholic elementary schools in the archdiocese; interview and resume tips; and a question and answer session. Current teachers have the opportunity in the next couple of weeks to participate in practice interviews with members of the Elementary Education Team from the Catholic Education Office. Current teachers will be interviewed for teaching positions prior to outside candidates being considered.

Maureen DePriest, Associate Superintendent for Elementary School Administration/Director of City Catholic Elementary School, and the new principal, as well as other members of the Catholic Education Office staff, will form the teacher interview team.
