Vatican Communicates Another Parish Decree Decision

This week, the Archdiocese of St. Louis received another decision from the Dicastery for the Clergy regarding an All Things New decree.

After studying the acts of the case for St. Paul parish in Berger, the Dicastery for the Clergy rejected the petition for hierarchical recourse, thus upholding Archbishop Rozanski's May 24, 2023, decree, in which St. Paul was subsumed by Assumption parish in New Haven, effective August 1, 2023. These are the remaining parishes for whom there is an outstanding appeal:

- St. Bernadette
- St. Agnes
- St. Lawrence
- St. Matthew
- Our Lady of Sorrows
